We render a **health care service** to poor and needy persons, including the care for people living with HIV/AIDS at the hotspot of the AIDS pandemic in the world, the North Coast of Zululand in South Africa.

Our AIDS treatment (HAART) Programme comprises

Antiretroviral Treatment



We provide free Highly Active Anti-Retroviral Treatment (HAART) as comprehensive medical care including regular medical examinations, blood monitoring, on-going prevention or treatment of opportunistic infections, medical and psychosocial counselling and dispensing

of the drugs.

3905 outpatient consultations for584 patients on ongoing life-long treatment.3 new patients admitted.

Adherence Monitoring

Our Therapeutic Counsellors make home visits to our patients on ARV-treatment to ensure that they adhere to the treatment. This enables us to discover adverse drug reactions early and to prevent treatment failure.



2213 home visits made.

Relief Fund

Palliative Care Centre



We provide **residential Palliative Care** for terminally ill patients in our **Inpatient Unit.**

We can admit up to 40 patients, which makes us the largest inpatient hospice in South Africa.

- **2657** social workers' consultations (mostly for the Hospice, but also for the Bursary Fund and Relief Fund)
- 1421 outpatient consultations
 - 81 inpatients admitted
 - 37 inpatients accompanied when they died.

We send out mobile home-nursing teams, which supplement and support the family's home based care through hands-ontraining and additional aids in the home situation of the respective patient.

This includes the assessment of patients at home and proper medical **home care**.



81 patients enrolled.

- 1917 sick visits made.
- **269** patients **transported** by ambulance.
- 204 patient assessment visits done.

Relief & Social Care



We provide poverty relief by helping people in genuine cases of immediate need.

We provided relief in **118 social emergency cases.**



Poor Sick Fund

We provide poverty relief by helping sick people from our local community, if they cannot afford urgently needed medical treatment.

Child Care

Early Childhood Development Centre

We provide "edu-care" and an early childhood development service for underprivileged pre-school children.

69 children educated



We provided

21610 specialised food servings by1214 400g packs of milk powder and

- 576 1 kg packs of protein & vitamin enriched porridge
- in **302** consultations to
 - 149 malnourished children with an average of
 - 25 children per month.



Malnutrition Clinic

We provide a health care service to poor and needy persons by running a clinic, where we examine, treat and feed malnourished infants and teach their parent/carer in proper baby care and nutrition.

Child and Youth Care Centre



We look after, counsel and give a home to sick and healthy "Orphans and Vulnerable Children" (OVCs).

85 children looked after.24 of these were admitted in 2024.10 of these were discharged in 2024.

Bursary Fund

We provide poverty relief by giving bursaries to poor learners and students of our local community.

33 school bursaries5 tertiary bursaries granted.



Special events in 2024

Blessed Gérard's **Children's Home** had entirely restructured into four independent "family group units" and refurbished.

Blessed Gérard's **Early Childhood Development Centre** had been renovated with upgraded classrooms and kitchen, and new outdoor facilities were established.



The Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Eshowe, Wilfrid Fox Cardinal Napier OFM, blessed and opened them on 12 July 2024.
