## **Projects' Review 1996**

Now, at the end of yet another year, is a good time to reflect on the activities and achievements during the past year. The year of 1996 has really been a watershed year for the Brotherhood -

- Bursary Fund
- <u>Community Development Centre</u>
- Malnutrition Clinic
- AIDS Prevention / Education
- Friendship Club
- Pre-primary School & Crèche
- <u>Care Centre & Hospice</u>

Our volunteers have been marvellous and I am sure that God will bless them abundantly for all the time and effort they have sacrificed for the good of the community. We must not forget the families who the volunteers leave behind when they come to work in the Care Centre. We thank them most sincerely for allowing their family member to come to the aid of the needy.

We look forward to 1997 with anticipation, with expectation and with some trepidation. But, as we have already proved, there is an abundance of good will amongst our community and therefore favour the fact that we can be confident of receiving the help we need.

#### **Blessed Gérard's Bursary Fund**

This being our oldest project is sometimes not seen as very significant because by comparison with some of our other projects it is quite small. But it serves a good cause and fills a gap. We have sponsored two students this year, one at university and one at school.

#### **Blessed Gérard's Community Development Centre**

Having had administrative problems with this facility, the sewing school was closed for a period of time. However, I am happy to report that the school was reopened in July this year and is proving to be a wonderful asset to the community. Miss Thulile Nzuza, our teacher has taken twelve beginners under her wing and they have progressed from the preliminary course to almost completing the secondary course. The prize giving will take place early in 1997 when the latter course is finished and Sr. Bernadette has assessed the work. The school will reopen on 13<sup>th</sup> January, 1997. I would like to take this opportunity to express our sincere gratitude to Sr. Bernadette from Little Flower Convent, Eshowe, for assisting us in so many ways.

#### **Blessed Gérard's Malnutrition Clinic**

At any one time Sr. Nokuthula Thabethe has thirty three malnourished babies to treat and monitor.

We are proud to say that during this year she has been able to get six babies to such a good state of health that they need not come back to us for help on a regular basis.

#### **Blessed Gérard's AIDS Education Programme**

Dr. Thabethe and his team from Sundumbili have reached many people by travelling round to all the branches of our parishes to give talks.

The response to these lectures has been very inspiring.

#### **Blessed Gérard's Friendship Club**

Our senior citizens are indeed an asset to Mandeni. They have worked extremely hard to help the Brotherhood realise our dream of assisting the needy. The 35 members of the club donated R1490.00 during 1996, raised from the sale of items which the members had made themselves, as well as making and donating 15 knitted blankets, cushion covers and many other very useful items. The Christmas party, which they held to end the year off, was great fun. I am sure they did not need to eat again for at least a week! The tables were beautifully decorated with festive flower arrangements, ornaments and the like. The Friendship Club members, Helma Lintvelt, Joyce Buss and Margaret Hawthorn were all here the day before to prepare. The day arrived and all the members came bearing little gifts, a plate of eats and a broad smile. Linda Neethling had arranged some games and prizes. The lady who won "everything" was a visitor from Scotland, Megan Woolridge's motherin-law. Congratulations! The Care Centre was a buzz with activity. There were some sad faces when the morning (and the year of togetherness) came to an end. Fortunately this is only temporary and the first meeting of the New Year will be on 22<sup>nd</sup> January. 1997.
