## 21 January 2021



Our teenager boys and girls are embarking on an exciting new chapter in their lives, independent living. The youth of Blessed Gérard's Children's Home left the Care Centre to take up residence in two houses, which are owned the Brotherhood of Blessed Gérard on Anderson Road.

Boys between the ages of 13 and 18 occupied one house (69 Anderson Road) on 21 January 2021





while girls between the ages of 13 and 18 occupied the other (65 Anderson Road) on 26 January 2021. These houses are for the purpose of teaching the teenagers to live in a family environment and learn skills that will help them live independently when the time comes for them to spread their wings and fly solo.

They will, under the guidance and instruction of our caregivers, do all daily activities for themselves such as budgeting, shopping, cooking, cleaning, laundry, gardening etc. We look forward to seeing them learn and grow and tasting the delicious dishes they are learning to make.



**22 January 2021**



We were very honoured today by an official visit of the Deputy Head of Mission of the Hungarian Embassy in South Africa, Zsuzsanna Bernadett Rothschild. She could see with her own eyes what we could achieve through the help of the Hungarian Government through its relief agency "Hungary Helps".

# Annual Report 2021

## Activity Report

**The activities of the Brotherhood of Blessed Gérard and of Blessed Gérard's Care Centre in the year 2021, as in the year before, were concentrated on maintaining momentum in our existing projects: Blessed Gérard's Care Centre provides a comprehensive and holistic system of care:**

We render a health care service to poor and needy persons, including the care for people living with HIV/AIDS at the hotspot of the AIDS pandemic in the world, the North Coast of Zululand in South Africa.



Our AIDS treatment (HAART) Programme comprises

Voluntary Counselling and HIV-Testing (VCT)

We offer free and confidential HIV Tests to the general public.

20 patients tested.



Antiretroviral Treatment

We provide free Highly Active Anti-Retroviral Treatment (HAART) as comprehensive medical care including regular medical examinations, blood monitoring, on-going prevention or treatment of opportunistic infections, medical and psychosocial counselling and dispensing of the drugs.

3339 outpatient consultations for  
625 patients on ongoing life-long treatment.  
11 new patients admitted.

Adherence Monitoring

Our Therapeutic Counsellors make home visits to our patients on ARV-treatment to ensure that they adhere to the treatment. This enables us to discover adverse drug reactions early and to prevent problems.

145 home visits made.

Nutritional and Social Care

961 Covid-19 relief food parcels, blankets and second hand clothing delivered to starving AIDS patients.





## Hospice & Palliative Care

We provide residential Palliative Care for terminally ill patients in our Inpatient Unit. We can admit up to 40 patients, which makes us the largest inpatient hospice in South Africa.



**4895 social workers' consultations** (mostly for the Hospice, but also for the Children's Home, Bursary Fund and Relief Fund)

738 outpatient consultations

26 inpatients admitted

9 inpatients accompanied when they died.

We send out mobile home-nursing teams, which supplement and support the family's home based care through hands-on-training and additional aids in the home situation of the respective patient. This includes the assessment of patients at home and proper medical home care.

602 Covid-19 relief food parcels, blankets and second hand clothing delivered to starving home care patients.



120 patients enrolled.

52 sick visits made.

10 patients transported by ambulance.

5 patient assessment visits done.

## Relief & Social Care



**Relief Fund**  
We provide poverty relief by helping people in genuine cases of immediate need.

We provided relief in 5 social emergency cases.

**Poor Sick Fund**  
We provide poverty relief by helping sick people from our local community, if they cannot afford urgently needed medical treatment.





## Child Care

### Malnutrition Clinic

We provide a health care service to poor and needy persons by running a clinic, where we examine, treat and feed malnourished infants and teach their parent/carer in proper baby care and nutrition.



### We provided

- 30330 specialised food servings by
- 1348 400g packs of milk powder and
- 674 500g packets of future life fortified porridge in
- 337 consultations to
- 59 malnourished children with an average of
- 28 children per month.



### Children's Home

We look after, counsel and give a home to sick and healthy "Orphans and Vulnerable Children" (OVCs).



- 21 children were admitted.
- 10 children were discharged.
- 60 children lived here on 31 December 2021

### Bursary Fund

We provide poverty relief by giving bursaries to poor pupils and students of our local community.

363 bursaries granted.

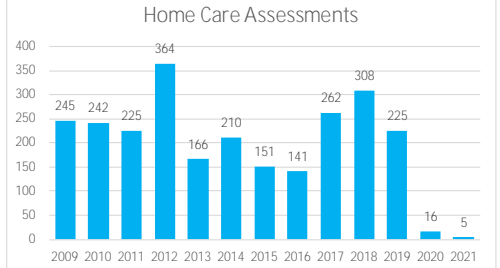
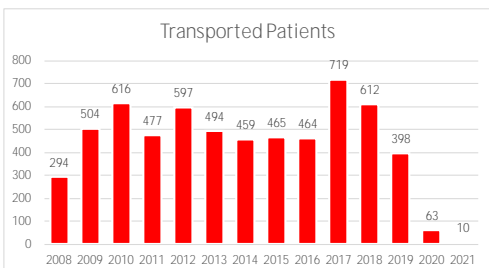
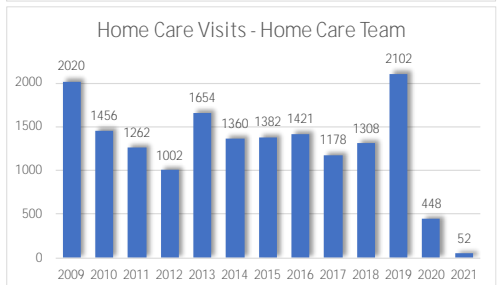
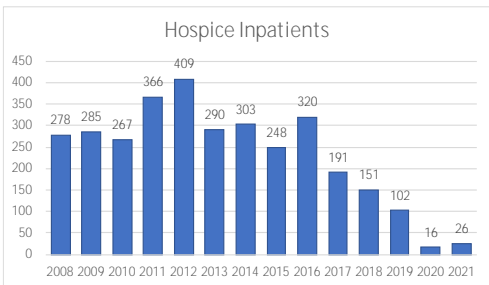
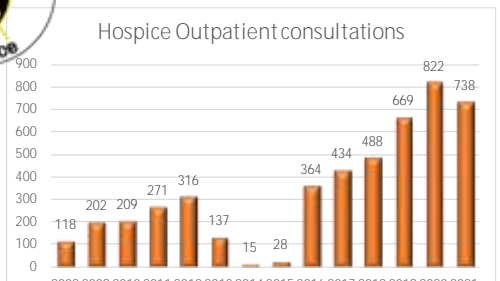
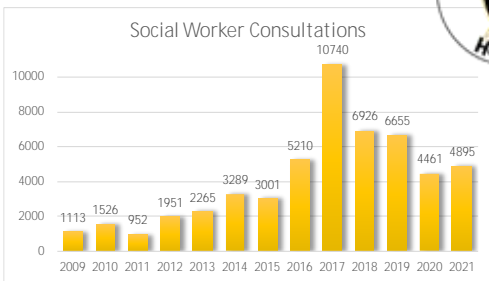
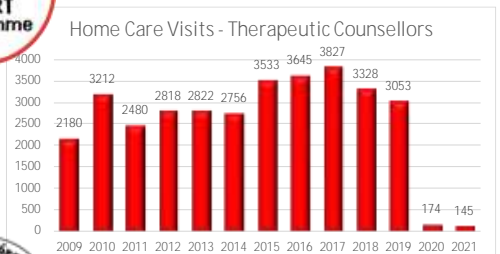
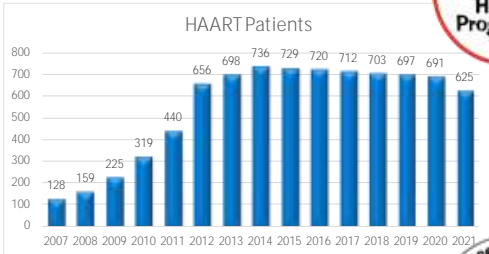

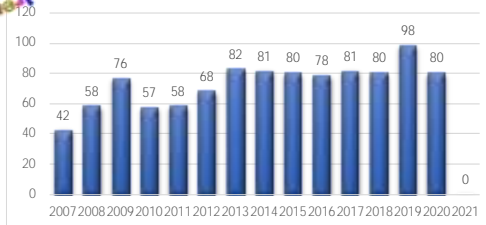




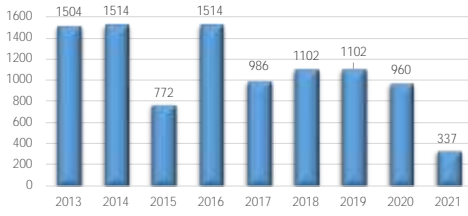
Children - Children's Home



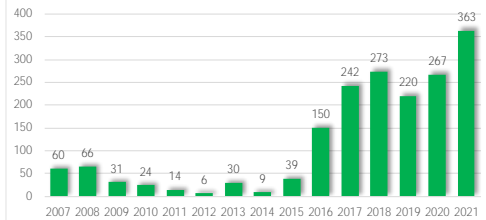
Children - Pre-Primary School & Creche



Malnutrition Clinic - Consultations

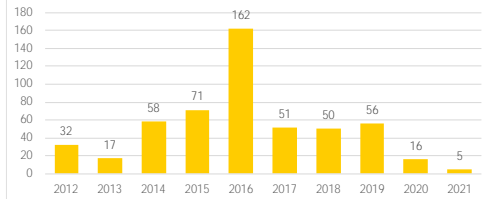

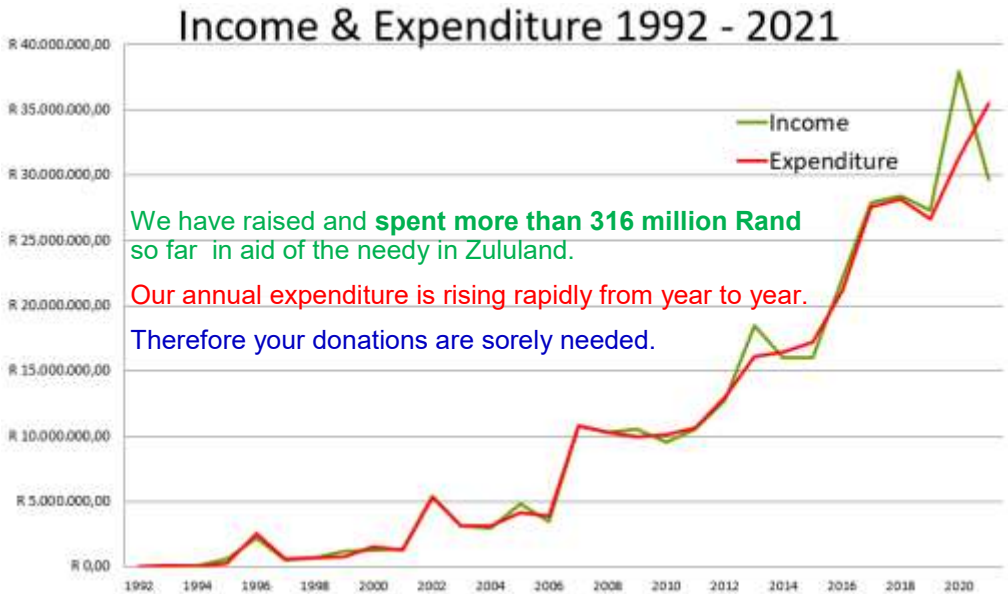


The noticeable statistical decrease in several areas of our activities in 2020 and 2021 is due to necessary **Covid-19 restrictions** to protect our immune deficient patients and children (especially those with comorbidities) and our personnel from possible infection. The Pre-Primary School & Crèche is still closed. The AIDS therapeutic counselling, hospice inpatient admissions, hospice homecare visits, assessments and patient transport had to be minimised. We hope and pray that we will be able to resume all our activities responsibly as soon as possible.

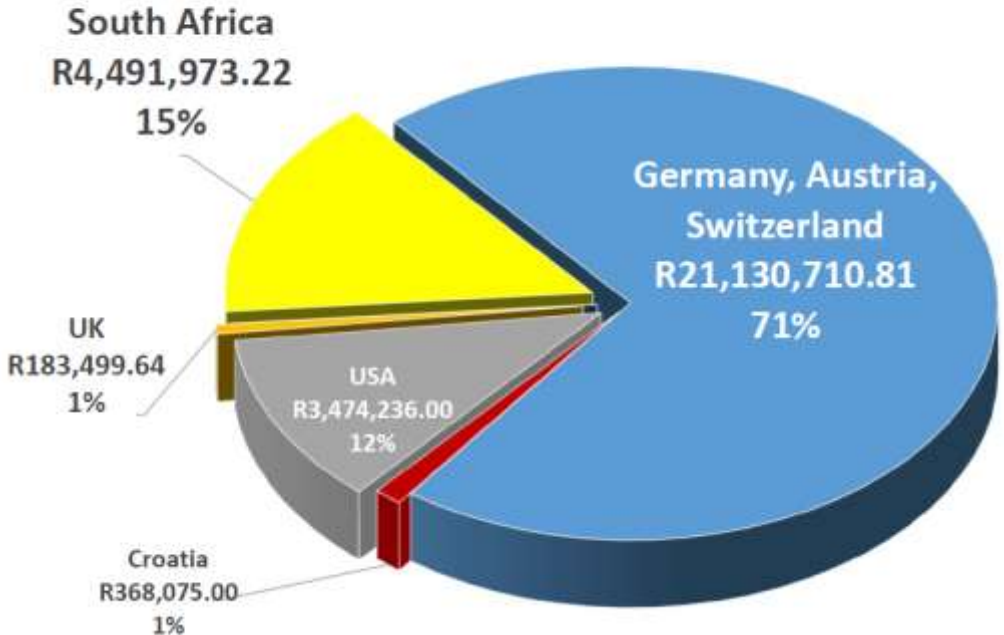

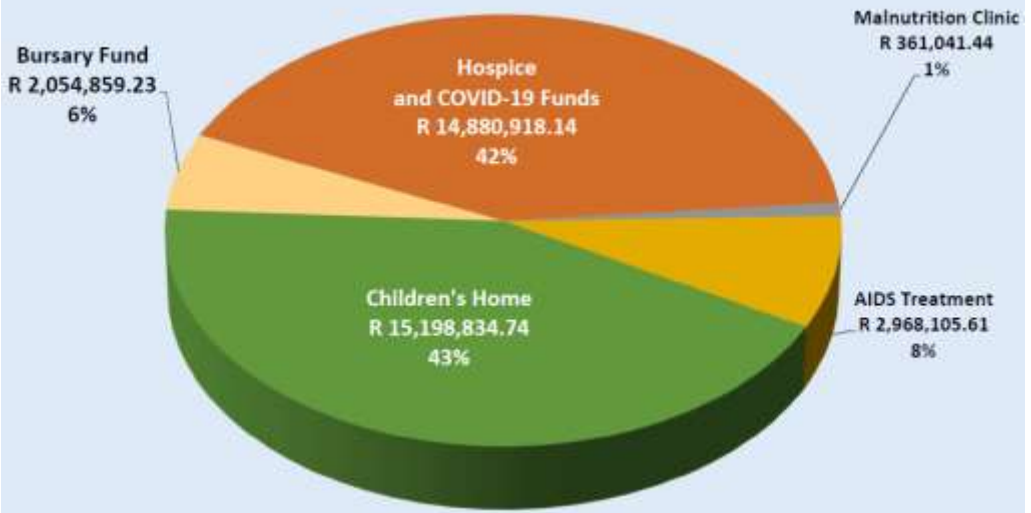

## Income and Expenditure in 2021

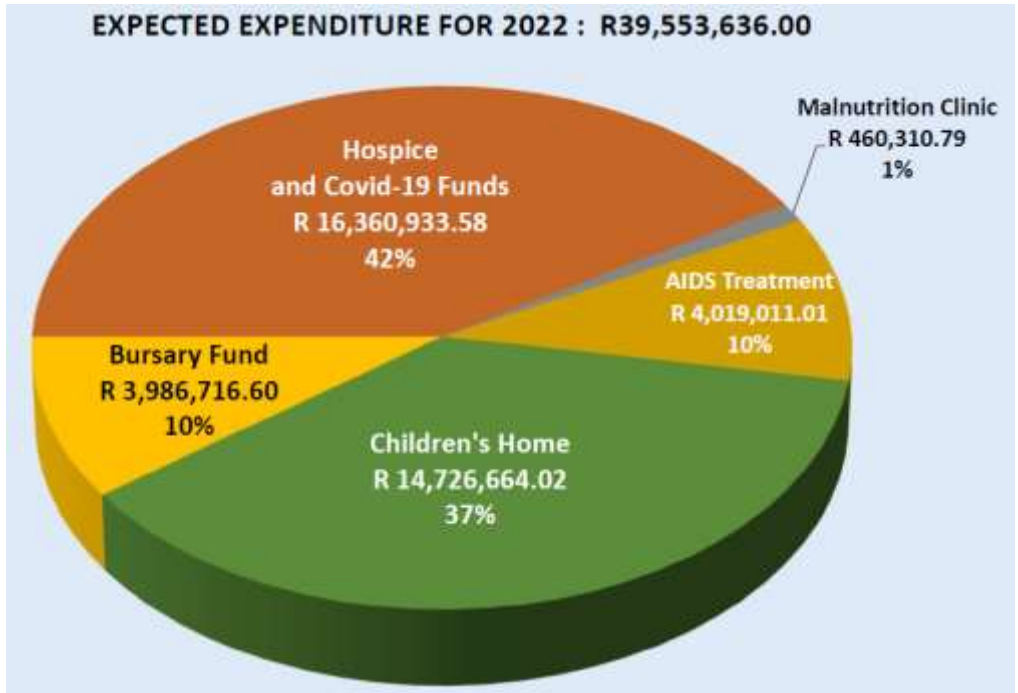
SOURCES OF INCOME 2021 : R29,648,494.67

**We wholeheartedly thank all our donors for enabling us to render our services.**

We serve an impoverished community.

Therefore we have to offer all our services free of charge and must rely solely on donations and grants to finance our work.

We included the monetary value of the benefits in kind (medicines and laboratory for our AIDS treatment programme) from the Department of Health of KwaZulu-Natal as income and expenditure in the financial report again.

International donations via the PayPal account of our German benefit association are part of the donations from Germany.

### Financial Audit:

The external Financial Audit of the Brotherhood of Blessed Gérard and of Blessed Gérard's Care Centre for 2021 had **spotless results** again because of the expertise of the bookkeeping company "Burrows & Associates" (especially Mrs. Angelee Botha) which has kept our books for years impeccably.

### Special event in 2021

The **Covid-19 Pandemic** continued over the year. Several of our activities were **severely impeded**, especially the AIDS Adherence Monitoring, the Hospice Inpatient Unit and Home Care and the Relief Fund (which have only been fully functional towards the end of the year 2021 again), whereas the Pre-Primary School and Crèche is still closed and intended to be re-opened as soon as possible in 2022.

The pandemic confronted us with **extraordinary challenges** over and above our usual routine services:

We faithfully took care of the high-risk group of our **immune deficient and geriatric hospice patients** and the **children** of our children's home where some are **particularly at risk from previous illnesses**.

We continued to ensure that the 625 patients we treat for life in our **AIDS treatment** program, despite the restricted freedom of movement due to Covid-19, reliably received their life-sustaining, highly effective antiretroviral drugs and were able to take them daily.

We also took care of our needy **home care and AIDS patients** at home. Many of these patients and their families had lost their sources of income and were starving.

We have distributed 1563 food parcels (each feeding a family of four for a month) to 154 families in 2021.

Our Clinic for **malnourished infants** continued to prevent starvation, **examined** the children, advised and **counselled** their caregivers, and provided an average of **6636 baby food meals** per four-week-cycles.

The founder of the Order of Malta, Blessed Gérard, died on September 3, 1120 and the church consecrated to him was thus blessed on the 876th anniversary of his death. The church is the seat of the South African relief organisation of the Order of Malta, the Brotherhood of Blessed Gérard.

Blessed Gérard's Care Centre is the headquarters of the organisation.

Even back then, after it was founded on 28 October 1992, they were running their aid fund for poor sick people, emergency aid fund, scholarship fund, child hunger aid project, home economics school, senior citizens' club, sewing school, HIV / AIDS awareness program, kindergarten, and their disaster relief project.

The opening of the Blessed Gérard's Care Centre marked the beginning of the hospice.

Later the first aid service, the children's home and the AIDS treatment program were added.

All of these services were not developed on the drawing board, but were each a courageous and effective response to specific emergency situations on site that had otherwise not been dealt with or not adequately dealt with by others.

The Care Centre is the fulcrum of this comprehensive program of holistic care in the middle of an area of a quarter of a million people, often referred to as the AIDS stronghold of the world, where over 40% have not even attended secondary school and over 80% live in poverty.

On 20 May 2020 the district of iLembe, in which Mandeni is located, had the second highest Covid-19 infection rate in all of South Africa, and on 27 August 2021 the seven-day incidence was 237.

The activity report of the centre impresses with notable statistics:

More than 10,000 patients have so far been treated and cared for by the Care Centre.

5420 inpatients,  
4673 outpatients,  
5134 home care patients,  
7654 ambulance transports,  
3623 counselling consultations,  
1624 AIDS patients and 2240 social cases.

The current statistics can be found on pages 15 ff. of this newsletter.

But even more than these statistics, the idealism, the devotion and the tender loving care of the Centre's many full-time and voluntary helpers for the patients, clients and people looked after are a reason for pride and lasting gratitude.

Most of our staff come from the same poverty-stricken area as our patients.

That is why we have an even greater responsibility for our staff.

We are a popular employer. Given the catastrophic unemployment rate in this country, the fact that we pay 94 people better than a living wage means a lot. A whole bunch of unemployed family members is dependent on every breadwinner. A salary is usually filling 10 to 20 hungry stomachs. This means that up to 1,500 people a day are incidentally, so to speak supplied with the essentials. For that reason alone, it would be socially unjust if we only paid starvation wages.


Our volunteers, like the full-time employees, therefore also receive two full meals per shift, adequate reimbursement of expenses and free on-site medical treatment and medication.

When outsiders call the house a “**heaven of care in the midst of the AIDS hell**”, “**where love overcomes misery**” and the beneficiaries experience a “**culture shock of love**”, the goal “*tuitio fidei et obsequium pauperum*” (**preservation of faith and help the Poor**) is achieved, which appears on every badge of the Brotherhood of Blessed Gérard.

The South African relief organisation of the Order of Malta has reason to be lastingly grateful – Thank God we are now also supported by the South African Department of Social Development and the Department of Health, but we have to raise the vast majority (89%) of our annual financial needs through fundraising – for the many donors and supporting members, who thankfully always made it possible up to now to raise the funds to fulfill the huge demand to finance all the vast activities.

Trusting in your help I always want to protect the faith and have an open heart for my neighbour, especially the Poor, the Sad, the Lonely, the Handicapped and the Sick.

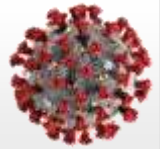

Blessed Gérard's Care Centre (BGCC) is excited to welcome Dr Douglas Ross to the BGCC Team, as its new Managing Director or "MD". St Mary's Hospital, Mariannhill, where a number of BGCC staff trained as nurses over the years, functioned as a public-

Nursing College, and having held various positions on the board of a national faith-based non-profit organization, CATHCA, over a period of nearly 20 years. Dr Ross is currently the Chairperson of the board of CATHCA.

His various leadership roles on the Board of CATHCA enabled him to maintain his interest and involvement in the South African faith-based non-profit sector beyond St Mary's Hospital and in fact throughout his executive career. BGCC is itself a member of CATHCA. Hence Dr Ross has for many years now had dealings on occasion with BGCC.

He holds an MBA and remains a registered family practitioner, who continued clinically caring for patients (mainly religious personnel and staff), as a part-time general practitioner for 20 years of his 26-year executive career. His clinical skills were used again more recently in the capacity of a voluntary part-time medical officer at the Usizo Lwethu Afrisun Clinic at the Denis Hurley Centre in downtown Durban.

Dr Ross is highly resilient, having worked in the challenging public/non-profit partnership environment at St Mary's Hospital and the independent private hospital environment at Midlands Medical Centre, Royal Hospital and KwaDukuza Private Hospital.

He thrives in diverse settings, having worked effectively with stakeholders from multiple disciplines across all healthcare sectors (public, private, and non-profit) from South Africa, SADC countries, and internationally (USA, Italy, and Israel). His respected standing in these diverse environments is evidence of Dr Ross's communication, relationship building, and networking skills
